





STUDENT INFORMATION: What happens after your assessment?

After you have completed your assessment;

- the assessor will write a report based on the information you discussed and the documentation you provided for your assessment. You can expect your report to be with you 10 working days after your assessment date. If you have chosen to see a draft or your report this may cause a delay of up to 5 working days.
- the report will suggest strategies that you can use with regard to your study and also recommend the type of assistance you require from Disabled Students Allowance (DSA), including the need for any equipment or personal support.
- copies of the report will be sent to you and your funding body (e.g. Student Finance England etc). If you have given NERAC permission to do so, a copy will also be sent to your University/College Disability or Learning Support Adviser.
- it is the responsibility of your funding body to decide what support you will get from DSA. NERAC is not part of this decision-making processes.
- your funding body will contact you directly with the decision on what will be funded from DSA.
- NERAC does not order or supply equipment for you. It is your responsibility to do
 this, according to your funding authority's guidelines. If you have a Disability Service
 at your college/university you might want to contact them for advice.
- if you have been funded for assistive technology training you should contact the approved training supplier when you have a delivery date for your equipment and software.
- if you have been funded for Specialist One to One Study Skills, Specialist Mentor or any other Non Medical Help (i.e. a BSL Interpreter etc) you are advised to contact your university/college Disability Support Team for advice or assistance to set this up.
